18. HEARING REQUEST is replaced in its entirety with the following

18. HEARING REQUESTS AND SCORING INQUIRIES

- 18.1 Hearing Request Forms and Scoring Inquiry Forms are available at the race office. Protests, requests for redress, scoring inquiries or a request for reopening a hearing shall be delivered to the jury desk on the second floor deck of the SSA clubhouse or emailed to the race office (SSA.race.office@gmail.com) within the appropriate time limit.
- 18.2 The protest time limit is 60 minutes after the race committee signal vessel Dock Time posted on the official notice board.
- 18.3 Scoring inquiries concerning actions of the race committee (OCS, DNS, etc) and requests for redress based on an incident in the racing area shall be submitted within the protest time limit. This changes rule 62.2.
- 18.4. The scoring inquiry process is as follows:
 - 18.4.1 If a competitor believes there is a scoring discrepancy, the competitor may complete the Scoring Inquiry Form and submit the form to the jury desk within the protest period for actions of the RC Signal Vessel and within 45 minutes of when score results are posted on the official notice board.
 - 18.4.2 The race committee will review the request and determine whether there is a scoring error.
 - 18.4.3 If the competitor is unsatisfied with the outcome of the scoring inquiry process, the competitor may file a request for redress, which must be submitted as soon as reasonably possible.
- 18.5 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses and where the hearings will be held.
- 18.6 Notices of protests by the race committee, technical committee or protest committee will be posted on the official notice board to inform boats under RRS 61.1(b).
